 - Cheryl attended the holiday dinner honoring Nada Barry, an early champion of SAFE. Photo shared on social media
 - Alana reported out on school: HUGS + SAFE (Jackie, Alana, Rebecca) met with Pierson MS/HS staff about prevention initiatives in the school and our continued partnerships
 - HUGS Evidence-Based programs in MS (6,7,8)
 - Pierson guidance staff (TBD) to represent the school as sector members on SAFE coalition, hopefully will be on our February meeting



- Open Gym dates have been shared with Brittany and they are being finalized. Once they are approved, the flyer will be shared with all the dates
 - Insurance requirements have been increased so it has caused a delay in the process with getting the dates to the school
- Parent/Caregiver workshops:
 - Jan Workshop: New Year Now What?:
 - Alana spoke with Brittany at Pierson and it was decided to postpone due to lack of time to promote the event
 - Will look at February dates and choose a new one be mindful of winter break. Alana was thinking February 9 since we will have the library space and could have a small meeting before the workshop
 - School is willing to partner and promote with families they have expressed enthusiasm
 - 5th and 6th grade students and families are very enthusiastic and interested in doing activities in the community
 - Rebecca noted that she has observed a shift in 6th to 7th grade, different groups break out, they become less and less willing to become involved. It is important to to include them in prosocial activities will they are a captive audience
 - Alana os planning on putting together a Red Ribbon Week planning committee
 - Invite Elem School principal
 - This can be a school wide initiative
 - Alana will reach out in February to build this committee before the end of the year
- 3. Elementary school families
 - SAFE will set up a resource table at pick-up to connect with families
 - Offering workshops for families on safe space/communication:
 - Kym has presented twice before/ Rebecca put together and it included child care and pizza
 - PTA promoted it- it was well attended
 - Rebecca suggested to hold one in the winter and one in the spring, she feels these workshops would be well received with the legalization of marijuana and the confusion/ concern of safety around it
 - Utilized middle and high school students for the child care in the past
- **4.** Open Gym 2023 Dates & Themes for each month: ***activities that are always available include basketball, Giant jenga, connect 4, etc. and there will be a theme each week*



- Karin suggested we hold the January date at an earlier time so the students can go to the Middle School play
- Pizza will be donated from American Pie (Rebecca), could bottled waters donated by the beverage center? (Karin will ask): we can promote businesses in our flyer
- Gaga pit in the gym is a large attraction
 - We can be flexible in the gym space if sports are practicing (learning center gym is ok, gaga pit won't be there)
- Alana offered the idea of a Parent workshop in tandem with Open Gym one month? The group felt we wouldn't get a large audience

 - Include substance free language as well
 - Rebecca suggested another idea of a Volleyball tournament with volleyball coaches- going to check their availability if Jeff not available
- Feb 17 Glow Night with Karaoke and Tik Tok Dancing (partnership with Southampton Youth Bureau)
 - Use "KaraFun" app + microphone for karaoke
 - Southampton Youth Bureau can lend their glow equipment
 - Tracy suggested 2 hour set up time
